RING 1 - IN HAND CLASSES start 9am SHARP

Judge: Ann Brown

*** SWPA Qualifier classes**

Class 1 Best Turned Out Horse/Pony Open

This class may be split at the judge's discretion:

Class 2 Best Condition Horse/Pony

(a) Kept entirely at grass (b) Stabled/partly stabled.

Class 3 Open Young stock

Open to yearlings, two and three year olds. All types. Will be split if sufficient entries.

Class 4 * Coloured In-Hand to include — Roan, Palomino, Appaloosa and Dun

This class may be split at the judge's discretion:

Class 5 * – Potential Competition Horse/Pony

Open to Horses/ponies 6 years and under.

This class may be split at the judge's discretion:

Class 6 * Mountain & Moorland Open Cards can only go to horses / ponies registered M&M's

(a) Small breeds – Shetlands, Exmoor, Dartmoor, Welsh A & B

(b) Large breeds – New Forest, Connemara, Dales, Fell, Highland, Welsh C & D

Class 7 * Veteran - special rosette to eldest veteran SWPS cards only to horses over

(a) 16-20 years

(b) Over 20 years

Class 8 Best Mannered

Open to all ages and sizes. You may be asked to give a demonstration showing why your horse or pony is well mannered – i.e. able to back, turn, lead correctly and stand still.

Class 9 * Best Handler child aged between 4yrs - 16yrs

This class may be split at the judge's discretion:

Ring 1 Championship.

Sash awarded for Champion and reserve champion

Winners only of each class/ section to come forward to the Championship which will be held promptly after Class 9 has finished.

RING 2 RIDDEN CLASSES – (9.30am sharp)

*** SWPA Qualifier classes**

Class 10 – Open - Best Turned Out Horse/Pony

This class may be split at the judge's discretion: (Open to lead rein)

Class 11 * Open - Best Rider

This class may be split at the judge's discretion: A) Seniors B) Juniors

Class 12 – Best Pony Club/Riding Club Pony

This will be judged on manners, suitability and individual show.

Not to exceed 15 hands. Rider any age, but must be a suitable size for the pony.

(Open to lead rein)

Class 13 – Riding Club Horse

This will be judged in the same way as PC pony. Exceeding 15 hands. Rider any age.

(Open to lead rein)

Class 14 * – Novice Horse/Pony & Rider

Open to any animal/rider who has not won a ridden showing class of any kind.

Snaffle bridles only.

This class may be split at the judge's discretion:

Class 15* – Ridden Cob

Open to all types of ridden cob. No upper height limit.

Class 16 * – Open — Coloured to include — Roan, Palomino, Appaloosa and Dun

This class may be split at the judge's discretion:

Class 17 * – Mountain & Moorland Cards can only go to registered M&M's

(a) Small breeds - Shetlands, Exmoor, Dartmoor, Welsh A & B (Open to lead rein)

(b) Large breeds – New Forest, Connemara, Dales Fell, Highland, Welsh C & D

Class 18 * – Veteran - Special rosette awarded to eldest veteran

This class may be split at the judge's discretion: (Open to lead rein)

Class 19 * - Potential Competition Horse/Pony

Open to any horse/pony 4-6 years old. Will be judged on conformation, manners, movement and show.

This class may be split at the judge's discretion:

Class 20 - Open - Happy Hacker

Judged on manners suitability and compatibility of horse and rider.

Should be correctly turned out for a safe hack .

RING 2 CHAMPIONSHIP

Sash awarded for Champion and reserve champion

Winners only of each class/section to come forward for championship.

This will be judged promptly after the finish of Class 20.

RULES/CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- The Organisers and owners of the showground and facilities, shall not be in any way responsible or accountable for any loss, injury or damage that may happen (from any cause or circumstances whatever) to exhibitors or their servants or agents or other members of the public, to any animal or property or to any vehicle brought onto the Showground or on premises used in conjunction with the Show, or while entering or leaving the same or otherwise for anything else in conjunction with, or arising out of, or attributable to the Show.
- Any member or exhibitor wishing to lodge a complaint/protest should do so in writing to the Show Secretary together with a deposit of £10.00. If on investigation by the Show Committee the protest is not sustained, the deposit will be forfeited to the funds of the show. All protests must be delivered within half an hour of the incident.
- The Organisers reserve the right to amend the Judge's and Order of Classes if it should become necessary.
- The Organisers reserve the right to cancel/amalgamate any class if insufficient entries.
- Riders must wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps/riding hats at all times when mounted. Spurs are not permitted. Showing canes can be no more than 30 inches long.
- SWP Cards can only go to ponies / horses registered with their breed society.
- There is an age restriction on children riding stallions, we will not give cards to any children under 12 riding a stallion.
- All dogs must be kept on a lead.
- Exhibitors entering classes which may clash do so at their own risk, no entry fees will be refunded
- The Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without giving a reason.
- Handlers of ponies in In-hand classes aged 14 years and under must wear correctly secured and current British Standard skull caps/riding hats.
- Any colt over 2yrs old must be bitted and handlers of Stallions / colts being shown must be over 16yrs of age.
